#### B-25 "Maid in the Shade" Turns 70

Delivered to the USAAF on June 9, 1944 and sent to Corsicaw, this 15 combat tour veteran turned 70 this year. It was converted into a ground attack version with 4 .5 cal M2 machine guns.

"It does have some repaired bullet holes in it," Gilmore said. "It went on some pretty hairy missions. It went out as a flight of four and was the only one to come back."

#### Replica P-40 To Be Installed in Honor of Lt. Col. Boyd "Buzz" Wagner

Lt. Col. Boyd "Buzz" Wagner became the nation's first WWII flying ace in the Curtiss P-40 Warhawk. A replica will be setup at the Johnstown-Cambria County Airport as a memorial later this summer. In 1941 Lt. Wagner is credited with shooting down eight Japanese planes in the Philippines, making him the US first ace of World War II.

#### Navy Pilot Cecil Evans Honored with a Statue

He served in the Navy from 1941 until the end of World War II, mostly with Fighting Squadron 18 on the Aircraft Carrier U.S.S. Intrepid. A status of him was erected at North Dakota Northern State University's campus.

## "Operation Overload" Equipment Re-Created by PBS

For this past anniversary of the US, British, & Canadian landing in Normandy during WW II PBS, along with Dassault Systems, recreated equioment used in the landing. They also build a full scale Waco Glider. They were part of the production team that helped NOVA recreate the D-Day landing for a documentary series.

"The first business of order was to build a virtual replica of the glider. Mehdi Tayoubi, Dassault's VP of digital & experiential strategy, and his colleagues couldn't easily extract meaningful volumes and measurements out of poorly preserved WWII blueprints of the gliders. Their best hope was to find a surviving aircraft. They found a match in the American heartland, 4,000 miles away from Normandy. At <a href="the Fagen Fighters World War II Museum">the Fagen Fighters World War II Museum</a>, Tayoubi and his team set out to capture the dimensions of a restored glider hanging in the museum using Faro Focus3D laser scanning equipment. "

#### Fly-Past in Aalten, Netherlands

The Royal Netherlands Air Force will do a fly-past where Flight Officer Leslie Pulfrey died on June 17, 1944 after bailing out of his damaged RAF Bomber. They had attacked the German city of Oberhausen. 6 of the 7 man Lancaster crew were killed.

#### Blown Overboard in a Kamikaze Attack

Seth Irving was a commander of a 40 mm AA battery on the USS Newcomb on April 6 1945 when that Destroyer, acting as a picket ship, was hit by 5 Japanese Kamikaze planes. The first one hit on the port side – he was stationed on the starboard side and was flung into the water by the impact. His 10 man gun crew were all killed.

As a commercial airline pilot Mira Slovak flew DC-3s in Eastern Europe. But under a full moon he and his flight crew instead flew out of the East and landed in Frankfurt to escape.

After 10 months of debriefing by U.S. intelligence officers, Mr. Slovak found work as a pilot for crop duster aircraft in Yakima, Washington.

Welsh fighter ace, James Ira Thomas 'Taffy' Jones, had a reputation for crashing aircraft on landing. He had 37 WWI kills. In World War II he was an acting wing commander at the RAF Porthcawl bombing and gunnery school and, flying an unarmed Hawker Henley, attacked a Junkers Ju 88 bomber with the only weapon he had, a flare pistol, which stopped the German plane attacking Swansea Docks.

Trained as a fighter pilot Miroslav Standera fled Czechoslovakia after it was given away in the Munich Agreement by PM Neville Chamberlain in 1938. He went to the French and then after France fell went to the UK and joined the British in No 312 Fighter Squadron along with 86 other Czech pilots during World War II.
