## Donald Myers - B-24 "Mickey" operator 445th Bomb Group

From September 1944 to March 1945, Myers flew as lead on all 30 of his missions, operating out of Tibenham and other bases in England.

### Clare Hollingworth - Reporting the Start of World War II

On assignment in Poland in the town of Gleiwitz on September 1, 1939, she called the British Embassy in Warsaw to tell them the Germans were invading Poland – they did not believe her.

"Hollingworth continued to show no fear, and take no shit, throughout her career. Travelling only with a typewriter and a toothbrush – what she called "a T and T" – and a pearl-handled revolver for her safety, she witnessed historic moments and took daring leaps to report fearlessly on the volatile world around her."

Hollingworth resides in Hong Kong. On Saturday, October 17, 2015, she turns 104 years old.

#### Once Buried You Stay Buried in a British War Cemetery

There are over 2,500 British Commonwealth cemeteries around the world, and where you fell in combat is where you stay.

No matter who you are, how well politically you are connected – your relatives remain where they fell.

Brig-Gen Frederick Hermann Kisch, the highest ranking Jew to serve in the British military during the Second World War was killed in April 1943 when he stepped on a land mine in Tunisia during the closing months of the North African Campaign. He is buried at Enfidaville War Cemetery in Tunisia.

## The Sole Survivor Law Was Passed in 1948 – too Late for 3 Brothers from Ashland

After the Sullivan Brothers were killed on the USS Juneau CL-52 in November of 1942 the law was proposed to ensure that at least 1 son would not be sent into combat.

For Norman and Ethel Ashcraft it was too late since in February of 1944 the last of their three sons, SSG Alden Ashcraft, was killed at Monte Cassino.

The remains were recovered with the coordination and cooperation of China. Due to the high altitude of the crash site, they had to wait till the glacier had moved the crash site down to a recoverable area.

The Sichuan province was where the first B-29 mission to Japan, of 70 planes, was launched in Junes of 1944.

## Sometimes Just Delaying a Victory Wins A War

Much has been written and speculated over the spring 1941 German southern attack into the Balkans had on the effect of the 1941 Russian Campaign.

Germany had told the USSR that the troops near the Polish border were there to be refitted before going elsewhere. When Germany did move some German divisions from Poland to attack into the Balkans it helped calm USSR (Stalin's') fears and helped reinforce the deception – even if unwillingly.

The broader impact is that this caused a change in some plans, removed some divisions from use in the USSR, especially the Airborne division, and may have delayed the start of the campaign from May 15<sup>th</sup> (original plan) to June 22, 1941. The subsequent fighting and garrison duties also permanently removed divisions from the OOB for use in the USSR.
