## The German War – Book review of a new work by Nicholas Stargardt

Covering the all the years of combat in a single book as it was understood by the everyday German is a daunting task that seems to have been accomplished in this new book.

"When Goebbels orchestrated his radio simulcast for Christmas 1942, the strains of "Silent Night" could be heard echoing from Lillehammer and Lapland to North Africa and Crete. Stalingrad was the eastern point of a vast continental triangle. This violent and exhilarating deprovincialization was an essential part of the German war experience."

# WW I Memorial Allowed to Stay

Built in 1925 as a tribute to the 49 men from Price Georges County who died in WW I, a bigoted atheist sued to have it destroyed since he did not like the memorial – since it was shaped like a cross but was totally non-denominational. And it happens to have the same proportions as the 50,000+ grave stones of those still buried in France from WW I and WW II – he has not sued to have them destroyed yet.

US Route 1 goes right by it in Bladensburg, Maryland.

## WW I Czechoslovak Legionnaires Re-Buried in Japan

Fighting under the command of Tsarist Russia against the Central Powers in WW I the Legion fought the Central Powers the till the Treaty of Brest-Litovsk ended the war with Russia. They then fought during the civil war with the White Russians against the Communists till they were forced eastward along the Trans-Siberian RR till they escaped to Japan where these five died. The rest of the Czechoslovak Legion returned to Europe.

# Spanish "Blue" Division Veterans Receive their Pensions

A treaty between Spain and Germany in the 1960s stipulated those veterans, since they fought under German control in WW II, were allowed to receive pensions – just like German soldiers get – and a few hundred still do.

Spain, on the other hand, stopped honoring their obligation to pay German Soldiers THEIR pensions to the Germans who fought for them during the Spanish Civil War.
