The 1941 Tank Battle Most Never Heard About

June / July of 1941 was filled with tank battles in the USSR – but the battle in the Ukraine was a two week long battle that is often overlooked due to the length and the type of tanks involved.

"The actual pre-war strength of the five Soviet mechanized corps consisted of roughly 3,140 tanks. Even allowing for a large percentage of non-combat losses during the approach to battle, these numbers still dwarfed the approximately 618 tanks that were available to the German commander."

The Rainbow Division of WW I

Just like in the Spanish American War there were only enough regular Army troops to create a single field division, which in WW I was around 16,000 total troops. So the US picked enough National Guard units from every state in the Union to create a full Army Division. National Guard Units were transformed from a State Militia controlled force as a result of the Spanish American War. Thus an Army Division, the 42nd "Rainbow" Division was created.
