Leather and Steel Flying Helmets

Early in the war US bomber crew members would put on Infantry style helmets – useful but not really geared for aerial combat by being bulky and prone to slippage. The Army Air Force quickly developed specialized helmets and flak jackets for bomber crews. One result of that research and deployment was that this B-17 crew made it home to England after combat.

An Operational Summary of the 1944-1945 Winter / Spring Offensive of the Soviets

The 1944 Summer Soviet offensive was only prelude to the final assault on NAZI Germany. The Real fighting in the winter in Poland and along the German border set up the final battle for Berlin for the Soviets. The Allies in the west knew that Berlin would be like Stalingrad – and the losses would be heavy in a street battle. The Allied commanders worried about losses, the Soviet leaders were taught not care about losses – if you had losses that mean you were fighting.

Based on the SVT-38, which was used during the 1939-1940 Russo-Finnish War, the follow-on version SVT-40 was fielded even though the cost, maintenance and training was substantially more expensive than the comparable bolt action Moisin-Nagant 1891 rifle. February 1943 Last of Germany's 6th Army Surrenders at Stalingrad

This eight-month long battle that started in June of 1942 lasted until February of 1943. The campaign cost the German, and their allies, over 350,000 dead, captured or wounded. It cost the Soviet military over a million killed, captured or wounded plus a few hundred thousand civilians killed due to a variety of causes. This battle caused the German more casualties than the total losses of the USA who were killed from December of 1941 to August of 1945 worldwide. [Note: current statistics ALSO count people who died anytime since 1945 that has any remote relation to their combat injuries, including suicide.]

This is a photo of some of the German dead who were collected after the battle but could not be buried due to the frozen ground. They were eventually put into a mass grave in spring of 1943. I am pretty sure that this was taken in the factory district looking east toward the Volga based on the buildings in the background.
