Shot down on mission number 35 – the normal magic number saying your bomber tour in the 8<sup>th</sup> AF was over from 1944 onwards – Irwin Stovroff instead ended up at the "Rest Haven on the Baltic" – Stalag Luft I.

#### 18 Missions till 2<sup>nd</sup> Schweinfurt

For 8<sup>th</sup> AF crews flying B-17 missions in 1943 a crewman was very unlikely to complete their 25 mission tour – Bill Davidson was one of those who got to 18 till the "Black Thursday" mission to Schweinfurt on October 14, 1943 when his B-17 was one of 60 shot down. He then went to Stalag Luft III to earn his promotions until the war ended. [Editor's note: While a POW Americans still got promoted in rank when the minimum time to the next rank was reached. Thus, you could be captured as a private and released as a Sergeant if a POW long enough.]

## A Toggler for "Cover Girl"

By the middle of 1943 the 8<sup>th</sup> AF no longer had a true bombardier in every B-17 doing an individual aim and bomb drop. They had converted to have the whole squadron drop when the lead plane salvoed so the number of bombardiers in training was cut for B-17s, and other crewmembers became "togglers". These crewmen were taught how to open the bomb bay and drop the bombs when the lead ship in their formation dropped. ## The 92<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Division in Italy

Parts of the 92 ID arrived in Italy in June of 1944 after the initial two years of training in the states (normal length of time for a US division), however, the division was not a

coherent unit until early 1945. The partial division was constantly "attached" to others before the other two combat commands arrived. Even then, it often had other units attached to it per common practice even after it was complete.

### NKVD – Everywhere they Went People Went to Their Graves

#### **B-26 Night Mission Near Caen**

Shot down between Baron-sur-Odon and Gavrus, which is around 20 miles SW of Caen in Normandy, the crew were all killed well behind German lines. The area was not taken by the British till late July 1944 during the breakout and by then all traces of the aircraft had been obliterated by the fighting that had taken place in the area.

The crew members are slowly being identified and Sgt John H Canty was ID'd on January 22, 2018.

## Soldiers from Burnley and the Victoria Cross

Burnley, which is east of the industrial city of Blackburn in Lancashire, was a small area that paid a heavy price in WW I. However, they started long before that in the Boer War. And like some other famous people, an accident ended their lives while living through front line combat.

#### **Double Medal Denied**

Awarded the Medal Of Honor in 1890 for rescuing a soldier by himself under heavy fire in the Indian Wars, he performed a similar rescue during the Spanish American War in Cuba and was denied – with the excuse being he already had one. A relative is trying to get that corrected.
