#### Modern Medicine is here due to Wars

This was true from the very beginning of wars. However, from the mmid-1700s the use of organized medicine, and research to help the wounded get back into combat, was more organized. As the armies got larger the need became more apparent and with the advent of the Spanish American War, and the Boer War, due to the sizes of the armies it became even more pressing. In American for the Spanish American War: "The biggest problem at this time was the inadequate supply of health care, including hospitals, doctors, and nurses. This made care and treatments scarce, to the point that there was an incurable ward, where it was said that it was nearly impossible to differentiate between the living and dead."

The modern health care system for civilians is all due to the needs of the military to save soldiers since the training was becoming so long that it is more efficient to save them than to train another.

# Richard J. Crosbie, 96, of Feasterville-Trevose, a Navy physicist whose research in aeronautics helped pave the way for the exploration of space, died Tuesday, March 5

Edward Simpson, who has died aged 96, was a mathematician and statistician who led the solution of some of the most important Italian and Japanese codes and ciphers broken at Bletchley Park during the Second World War.

Simpson was one of the cryptanalysts who broke the Italian Navy's Hagelin C38M cipher, allowing the Royal Navy to intercept the Italian supply ships taking fuel and equipment to Rommel's Afrika Korps. The Italian messages included the supply convoys' times of departure, routes and times of arrival at the various ports in North Africa, allowing Royal Navy submarines to pick them off at will.

So many supply ships were sunk that, in the wake of the Battle of El Alamein in late 1942, Rommel had only 11 serviceable tanks. T

Last month, the FAA issued an advanced notice of proposed rulemaking (ANPRM) regarding the safe and secure operations of small unmanned aircraft systems (UAS). In this ANPRM, the FAA is currently seeking comments on potential new rulemaking for operational and performance restrictions on UAS, including model aircraft. Over 10,000 occurred with around 6,000 planes lost in the USA during the war. One B-24 crashed in Florida in 1944.

The 129-building NAS Melbourne was commissioned from October 1942 to February 1946. Today, the airfield is Orlando Melbourne International Airport. More than 2,200 fighter pilots learned how to fly Grumman F4F Wildcats and F6F Hellcats.
