"Soundman Ben Burtt (Star Wars series, Raiders of the Lost Ark, Blade Runner). During that screening, Burtt confirmed to Nelson that he and Lucas had watched Wyler's Memphis Belle over and over again while they were creating the original Star Wars battle scenes."

Model Aircraft Flight Rules – May 2019 A summary as provided by Bill Whitsell of my Barnstormer RC Club

New FAA regulations are in effect as of May 17, 2019.

1. All flights must be for recreation -- no mixing part of the flight as commercial and part of it as recreation.

2. We must comply with the AMA Safety Code you or your spotter standing next to you must keep the aircraft in visual line of sight.

3. We must avoid flying near manned aircraft and give way to all manned aircraft.

4. We must NOT flying over groups of people.

5. We must not fly under the influence of drugs or alcohol

6. [NEW] We must not fly in controlled airspace without FAA authorization: note that Barnstormers is in Class D airspace because of Aurora airport.

7. [NEW] We must now fly below 350 feet above ground level.

8. [NEW] It appears that we are now confined to a radius of operations around our field of 660 feet centered on the geometric center of the runway. Note: This appears in a spreadsheet published by the FAA, but does not seem to be spelled out as a specific restriction -- so this may not be a regulation....yet. But assuming it is a regulation, here's a circle 660 feet in diameter:

10. [NEW] In the future we might be able to get waivers from the FAA using the Low Altitude Authorization and Notification Capability (LAANC) system currently used for authorizing commercial flight operations under Part 107. The FAA is modifying the LAANC system for use by recreational pilots.

11. [NEW] Also in the future, when the specific test has been developed, we must pass a knowledge and safety test and have proof of passing the test available for law enforcement officers and the FAA Administrator should he or she visit. There appears to be no lower age limit for the test.

12. We must register as recreational pilots with the FAA (\$5 for three years), get a registration number, and place that number somewhere on the outside surface of the aircraft.


# When There Really Were Militias It Made a Difference

It was rescued from its watery grave on the ocean bottom in 1971, said Pensacola museum historian Hill Goodspeed. Being local has its advantages. Reading about air battles then able to go to the location of them of both the targets and the aircraft location wrecks gives a whole new perspective. The Internet has made it easier to assemble the details – you don't have to spend years traveling to archives to read one bit of info at a time.

Peter Schiller, Bismarckplatz 6 b ; D-24629 Kisdorf Germany; has spent years researching every a/c crash site of the RAF and US AF for all of April and May of 1945.

Two Samples below:

3.4.45 Mission 8AF 924 to Kiel B17G-95-BO No 43-38871 96BG 339BS named "Ractup", was hit by AA but managed to fly to Sweden, Malmö-Bulltofter a/f, interned. Pilot Lt McFarland. No MARC due to interned.

100BG -1 Mission 8AF 924 to Kiel B17G No. 43-38992 of 351BS. MACR 13717 Lt. Baldwin. Target Kiel, could not release bombs, made to direction back, was short on gas, was hit by aa fire over Friesian Islands, Crashed on dutch island Texel, Watermolenweg, Hoornder Nieuweland. 8 KIA 2 POW.
