How History Works

More information was declassified through the 90s which allowed the study of the period to again move on. Anyone who has

studied the war over Europe must realize that its history has been constantly revised. The events that took place are the events that took place but our understanding of them has developed and in some cases changed. You might not agree with someone's opinion of how things happened but even then, you are only choosing to believe one revisionist view over another revisionist view. The USA did lot's of number crunching during WW II. IBM built and produced specialty EAM – electronic accounting machines – for all sorts of projects – to record and then analyze data from U-Boat sightings to aircraft damage.
