Collings Foundation 909 Landing Accident

There are lots of articles on this out there but here is a summary of what occurred after reading / watching / listening to around 15 different ones – and also reading the preliminary NTSB report.

- 1. Took off normally then a few minutes into flight contacted tower requesting return to land due to a #4 engine magneto problem
- 2. Did a normal downwind and turned onto final
- 3. Did not lower flaps
- 4. No indication of what the throttle settings were
- 5. Other 3 engines normal
- 6. No issues with fuel at airport
- 7. Landed short of runway onto the grass and veered right into the de-icing complex
- 8. Caught fire
- 9. People not initially hurt evacuated out after it stopped
- 10. Nose to tail then burned out

A lot of the reported stated it crashed which most people understand as falling from the sky in an uncontrolled manner. It was on the ground on rollout and hit airport items.

The final NTSB report, like most of them, will take two years or so before we get their known facts and guesses ("probable cause" in their language) as to what happened. *A short history of 909*

Flag Etiquette

It designates what military personnel and civilians should do while the national anthem plays. Individuals in uniform should salute the flag during the duration of the song. Veterans or military personnel not in uniform can salute the flag as they would if they were in uniform. Civilians should face the flag and place their right hand over their heart, while men should remove their hats.

In a movie set before WW II there are 2 Americans sitting at a Berlin Café when the German National Anthem was being played and two SA men were about to pummel them before they found out that they were American and had no idea what the song being played was. It was a punishable offense to NOT stand for the German song during the NAZI era – if lucky you were just beaten up -if unlucky you were sent to a concentration camp and if a minority you were just killed.

It is normal etiquette to stand an honor flag / national song of any country you are in – even your own.

The oldest WW II veteran still alive is thought to be the German Gustav Gerneth who fought on the Eastern Front and was captured.

As German historian Peter Longerich explained, when Hitler met the Grand Mufti on November 28, 1941, at the Reich Chancellery in Berlin, Hitler informed him that Germany was "resolved to urge one European nation after the other, step by step, to contribute to the solution of the Jewish problem, and when the time comes to non-European peoples with a similar appeal."
