#### Hitler's Birth House to Become Police Station

The private residence was purchased by Austria after years of negotiation with the descendant's original owners who had purchased it in 1913.

The state had forced them to stop renting it since the owners did not want to renovate it to bring it up to current housing code – since the house is a historical heritage site and it would not be in character with the house. It would be like putting in elevators and escalators into Mt Vernon main parlor in order to accommodate ADA laws. ## From a Dunkirk Paddle Door to Stalag Luft III

Les Rutherford was a regular infantryman at Dunkirk, but he did not want to be captured so he found a door and swam out to sea. Picked up by the Navy he made it back to England. He then went into the RAF as a bomb aimer in 50 Squadron for the next few years – till he was shot down on 20 December 1943 over Frankfurt. He died at 101. His diary showed what it was like in a POW camp.

The International Bomber Command Centre has a physical building and a memorial to those who served in the Second World War. It includes a digital archive, which belongs to the University of Lincoln.
