Last British Battle of Britain Ace Dead at 101

Sgt Paul Frames, Flying Hurricanes, was in France flying at the start of the War gaining 1 confirmed and 1 probable.

Stationed in Southern England during the battle he shot down a Ju-88.

"I gave him a couple of bursts and he crashed at Gatwick just on the point between the airport and the racecourse. It was particularly poignant for me," Farnes continued, "because I landed and the station commander took me over to meet the pilot of the German aircraft. I went to shake hands with him, but he wouldn't shake my hand. One of the gunners was all right, but the other was killed."

As of February 2020, now only 2 British pilots from the Battle of Britain are still alive.

Replacing the M4 Sherman after WW II

The M4 "Sherman" was a compromise of production, transportation bottlenecks (too wide and they cannot be shipped through the tunnels of the Appalachian or Rocky Mountains), and time. Told they were better than any German Tank they would come across it was true – in 1942. Fielded in 1943 and 1944 the design of the medium tank was outclassed by German improvement in tanks and shells.

Which is the Better Merlin – Rolls-Royce or Packard?

During WW II Britain could not build enough of everything so they let out contracts to build war material for them in the USA. Packard got the 1.2 tons of paper designs to build the Merlin engine and did so in numbers and quality that is hard to believe. By the end of the war, the Merlin 66 was making 2,050 hp compared the 1,030 hp in the Merlin II of Battle of Britain era.

"Of the total of 168,068 Merlin variants built, Packard produced 55,523. Rolls-Royce did even better at 82,117 (32,377 at Derby, 26,065 at Crewe and 23,675 at Glasgow), and Ford of Britain ultimately built 30,428 at its Manchester facility."
