The British 6 Pounder AT Gun

Designed to replace the 2 Pounder – 40mm diameter bore – which they discovered that the new tanks being built were almost immune from it – had to be replaced. Lead time from design to fielding was between 3 to 5 years for a new weapon in the 1930s. The new AT gun was a 43-caliber eapon, meaning the bore's length was 43 times its diameter of 57mm. The weapon could traverse 45 degrees to either side and elevate from minus five to plus 15 degrees.

Black Soldiers in the Civil War – For the Confederates

There have been a few movies about the Blacks Soldiers of the North who fought in separate regiments – under white officers but you do not hear about the blacks who fought for the Confederacy. They certainly did not fight to keep slavery.

"The number varies according to which historians you read, but either 43 or 45 slaves joined [General Naathan] Forrest. About 25 served as teamsters and tended to the horses, but 20 reportedly took up arms and fought alongside Forrest in battle, including at the infamous Battle at Fort Pillow. With the exception of one deserter, all the blacks who joined Forrest stayed with him throughout the war."

"When Nelson died in 1934, he had a military procession and his coffin was draped with a Confederate flag."

If none of that happens then no award. A Tasmanian Sailor never got written up for his. A Defence Honours and Awards Tribunal held hearings in Hobart in March last year [2019] to reconsider whether Sheean should be awarded Australia's top wartime honour.

Panzer Lehr and General Bayerlein

Adolf Hitter liked forming new units instead of having personnel fill out existing formations. Thus it would take often a year for a new unit to be ready to be fully trained to fight whereas if those personnel has been sent as replacements to existing units they would, after a few weeks of inhouse training, be fully operational and useful in their new unit. Panzer Lehr Division was one such unit created from scratch then sent into combat.
